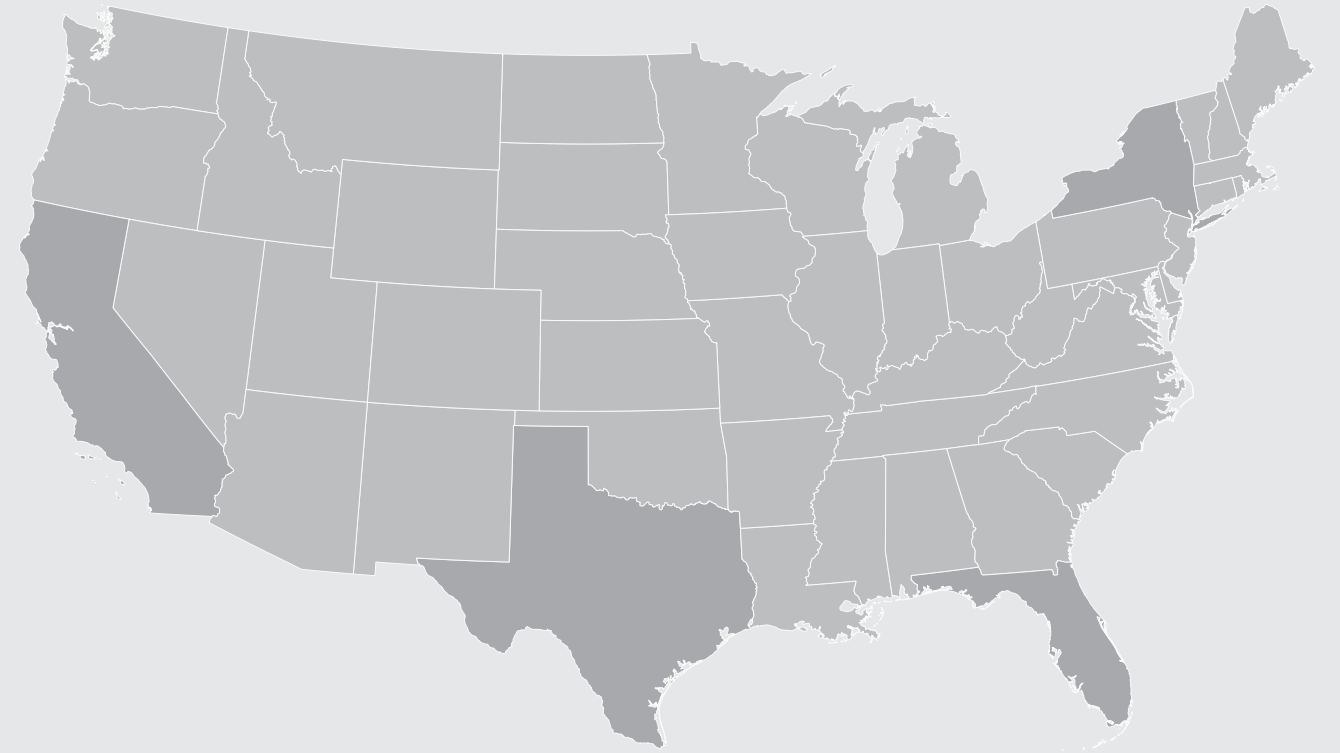

SOUTH FLORIDA SIZZLING WITH BILLION DOLLAR PROJECTS

Miami is graduating from being a horizontal, garden city with just a sprinkling of towers, to a striking metropolis of sky-reaching structures. This conversion is being led by five active projects costing significantly over a billion dollars each, along with even more developments that are just under the billion dollar mark. Many of these projects boast world-class innovations. Noteworthy among them is the rooftop aerie of the highly-anticipated Sugar, East Miami Hotel's restaurant in the almost-complete, billion-dollar Brickell City Centre (BCC). When completed the BCC will be cover four city blocks and include high-end retail, condos, offices and the tallest building in Miami. Developments such as this have had an impact on the overall market as home values in Miami-Dade County continued on an upward trajectory. Year over year the median sale price was up 12% in February 2016 to \$493,975 vs. \$434,598 in February 2015. Even so, home sales slowed slightly in February to 815 units vs. 842 in the previous month of January, while days on market increased to 90 days vs. 73.

When Lee Ann Moody decided that being an appraiser was the career path she wanted to pursue, she didn't have to look far for inspiration or someone to train her—her sister already was an appraiser. Lee Ann earned her appraisal certification 10 years ago and has been providing assessments for clients in Escambia and Santa Rosa County ever since. Her professional manner, strong work ethic and analytical skills have earned her accolades and a steady stream of repeat customers year after year.

PENSACOLA ECONOMY BOOSTED BY MASSIVE DEVELOPMENT

Phase 1 of the Navy Federal Credit Union expansion project is nearing completion and will add two huge office buildings with a combined 400,000 sq. ft. of floor space. Once Phase 2 is completed, the Navy Federal complex will occupy two million sq. ft. of office space and house more than 10,000 workers, making it by far the largest private employer in Northwest Florida. In addition to creating additional jobs, the expansion of Navy Federal Credit Union headquarters is creating significant growth in the Beulah area of Pensacola. New subdivisions are being developed, roads are being widened and improved, and new schools are being added in this previously rather rural area. Looking at the overall market, the year over year median sale price was up over 16% in February 2016 to \$128,000 vs. \$110,000 in February 2015. Meanwhile the number of homes sold in February rose over 11% to 256 vs. the previous month of January when it was 224, while the average days on market was more or less the same at 87 in February and 92 in January.

LACK OF INVENTORY SPURS NEW BUILDS IN ORANGE COUNTY

Orange County, California saw an increase in sales activity during the past year. Home sales were up approximately 14% and, due to a surge in market activity, inventory dropped approximately 10%. As a result, there has been an increase in demand for new home builds, which has led to a jump in sales in cities such as Irvine, Rancho Mission Viejo and other pockets of small land throughout Orange County. Overall, the Orange County real estate market has remained relatively stable across the area with the year-over-year median sale price for February 2016 increasing by 8% over February 2015.

LARGE HOME SALES BOOMING IN CARMEL VALLEY

A great deal of new construction is occurring in the Carmel Valley area in San Diego, specifically in the Pacific Highlands community. Large custom homes are being built with prices ranging from \$900,000 all the way up to \$1,700,000. Couple this with the many new schools in the area and exciting commercial construction projects being developed featuring large anchor stores, and it's no wonder this community is becoming a very desirable place to live. Comparing the overall marketplace numbers for February vs. the previous month of January, the median sale price was up to \$668,000 from \$660,000, while the number of home sold rose to 1,462 from 1,411. This increased sales activity influenced the inventory of homes which dropped to 1,090 in February from 1,139 in January.

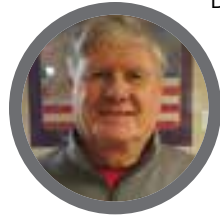

TECHNOLOGY TRANSITION CONTINUES IN ROCHESTER, NY

The transition of Rochester, NY from a city known for manufacturing to one that is technology-focused took another step towards reality with the announcement of a new \$500 million fund. Seeded by state/federal and private dollars, the fund will be used to finance the development of a new Photonics research center. Combined with Rochester's consistently low home prices, low interest rates and the low cost of living, it is hoped that the new research center will attract hundreds of high-tech jobs. No doubt this was one of the factors that helped spur on a year-over-year increase in the median sale price in Rochester; it rose 11% from \$99,000 in February 2015 to \$110,000 in February 2016.

PEOPLE MOVING BACK INTO THE CITY OF BUFFALO

The Buffalo, New York area is transitioning from its blue collar industrial past to a more white-collar, tech-based area centered around the burgeoning, downtown medical corridor. As a result, the City of Buffalo itself is experiencing residential demand with people moving back to the city from the suburbs and ex-residents moving back as opportunities expand. Year over year the median sale price, at \$128,000, was up slightly in February 2016 vs. \$125,000 in February 2015. On a month-to-month basis, the number of homes sold in February was down to 338 vs. 413 in January, while the average days on market was only slightly less at 34 days in February vs. 36 in January.

COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT HAS DALLAS MARKET BUZZING

Many exciting things are happening in Dallas, especially on the commercial front. Toyota and several other companies have either moved or are moving their headquarters to the north Texas region. The Dallas Cowboys football team has started construction on their new practice facility in the City of Frisco, north of Dallas. The completion of the Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge, connecting downtown Dallas to the more industrial west, has fueled the construction of restaurants and homes along the Trinity River. Despite the drop in oil prices, Texas has continued to add jobs, mostly along the I-35 Corridor of Dallas, Austin and San Antonio. In 2015 employment in Dallas actually expanded 4.5% and the Feds are projecting the Dallas-Fort Worth market will continue to grow at a higher rate than the overall Texas growth rate. As for the numbers, home sales in Dallas were up 4.8% in 2015. Permits for new, single-family homes in the entire metro area are up nearly 26% vs. 2015, and with housing market inventory at a historical, two-month low, the outlook for the spring of 2016 is very promising.

JOBS, JOBS, JOBS THE STORY IN DALLAS/COLLIN COUNTY

The Dallas/Collin County area has enjoyed a real influx of employment opportunities recently, mainly due to the expansion of the Highway 121 corridor. This has helped encourage many well known companies to relocate to the area, including State Farm Insurance (8,000 jobs), Toyota (4,000 jobs), Hewlett Packard, Frito-Lay and JC Penny to name a few. In addition, Nebraska Furniture Mart has constructed a large store and warehouse which employs 2,000 people. Meanwhile, there are expansive, multi-million-dollar, mixed-use developments under construction as well as substantial residential subdivisions being built. Year over year the median sale price was up in February to \$204,250 vs. \$187,000 in 2015. Comparing February to the previous month of January, the inventory of home dropped to 20,948 vs. 22,334 and the average-days-on-market was more or less unchanged at 26 vs. 25.

The Dallas-Fort Worth area has been experiencing an unprecedented level of growth. Schools, roads and new homes cannot be built fast enough to accommodate all the transplants looking for opportunity. Sellers are dominating the market as newly listed homes receive multiple bids over the asking price. Most of these homes never make it to the MLS, affecting the number of comparables and listings available for appraisers to use.

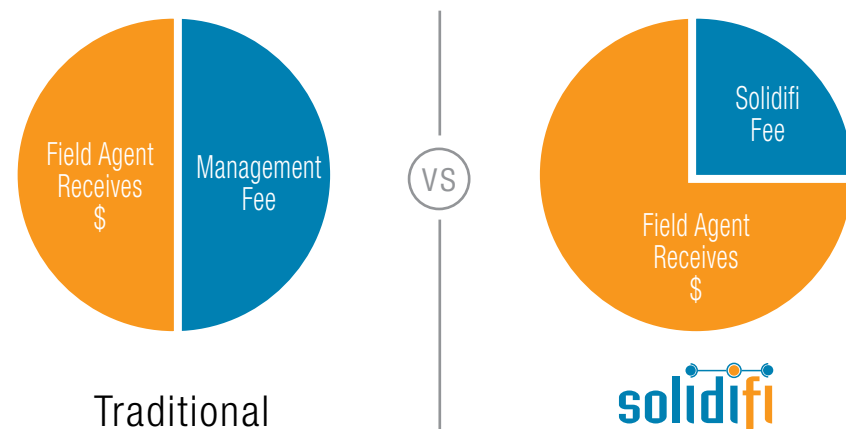
